OVERVIEW OF THE KEWANEE AREA UNITED WAY (KAUW)

THE THREE PILLARS OF UNITED WAY

Traditionally, the United Way has three fundamental operational goals (or pillars) that every United Way works to improve in their service area. These three pillars are health, education, and financial stability. Each agency partner to whom Kewanee Area United Way awards financial support, will in some way address one or more of these pillars.

WHO WE ARE

Kewanee Area United Way (KAUW) has proudly served Henry & Stark County citizens since 1957. It was started as the Kewanee Community Chest. In 1982, it became the Greater Kewanee United Fund. Since that time, it has transitioned to Kewanee Area United Way. Although the name has changed, the goal is the same, to improve the lives of those in this area through health, educational opportunity, and financial stability. It truly takes a village to meet those lofty goals. Through the financial support from area residents, partner agencies, the business community, volunteers and the encouragement and input from our community, it is possible to successfully meet the goals set each year.

ANNUAL CAMPAIGN

The Annual Campaign is held in the fall of each year. The kickoff date in 2022 was October 11th, hosted by a joint meeting of the Rotary and Kiwanis Clubs. KAUW was excited to return to this format as members of both clubs represent the leadership and business owners, operators and leadership in this area. The goal of the Annual Campaign is fundraising for the agencies selected to receive in the upcoming year. During this time, every effort is made to contact residents and businesses in the area. Each year, KAUW reaches out to both residents and businesses with a contact letter as well as in person contacts. Many businesses in the area have Workplace Campaigns in which employees pledge through payroll deductions. Pledge donations are sent to KAUW weekly, monthly or quarterly. During the Annual Campaign, KAUW also works with the agencies to provide information about the Agency Partners who will be receiving grants in the upcoming year.
